The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to recognize and honor the outstanding graduates of NPHS in the fields of Education, Medicine, Science, Law, Athletics and the Arts. They serve as role models for the current students.

The actual Hall of Fame portraits and biographies are located in the new cafeteria at NPHS and is open to anyone wishing to visit. Grover DeVault has devoted his life to the Military and Ministry as well as community service. He is a highly decorated military officer (LTC) and his records demonstrate achievements and accomplishments rarely reflected by others. Legion of Merit and Bronze Star for combat during 20 years of active duty. Franklin Township Couple Sends Old School Ring To Its 'Lost' Owner

A Franklin Township couple (Mike Randazzo, NPHS Class of 1974 and his wife, Nancy [Carlucci] NPHS, Class of 1975) that loves a mystery, played a pivotal role in returning a long-buried high school ring to its rightful owner.

In October of 2006, a PSE&G utility crew was digging on East Elmwood Drive in South Plainfield, when machine operator Jim Kelly noticed something glowing a foot down in the dirt – a South Plainfield High School ring from the Class of 1980. The initials DSH were engraved inside. He held onto it for almost three years, eventually passing it to a former SPHS student – fellow employee Mike Randazzo of Franklin Township. If Mike hadn't transferred to North Plainfield High School for senior year, he would've been in the South Plainfield Class of 1974.

Mike and Nancy started searching for the owner online without success. Next Mike visited the school, confirming from their stash of year-books who the owner had to be – David S. Hunter, the only one with those initials for that year. Some attempts by their staff were made to find Hunter, but then the trail went cold.

On a recent rainy weekend, with more online searching, a Wisconsin news article was found regarding an attorney in Milwaukee who inherited a ring collection through his father's metal-detecting efforts.

The Randazzos contacted the reporter to pick his brain. At first, Journal Sentinel reporter Jim Stingl mentioned some of the avenues to pursue that had already been exhausted, but then, apparently intrigued, he took up the search. After calls to two wrong David Hunters, he sent an e-mail to the Randazzos saying he'd found the right one.

Hunter had lived on the property where the ring had been unearthed. But he joined the military after high school and relocated. He served in Iraq and is now retired and living in Morehead City, N.C. The Randazzos mailed him the ring.

Hunter sent them an e-mail saying, "I want to thank you so much for going through all the trouble you have to find me... Never thought I would see it again. So many years later, here it is. What a story to be able to tell everyone."

Nancy sums it up: "Thanks to some sentimental utility guys, with the help of a curious long-distance reporter" the veteran has his ring, but it's "still a mystery how the ring hid below ground all those years."

Help the North Plainfield Education Foundation Raise Money for New Upper Krausche Synthetic Grass Athletic Field!

You may know by now that the Somerset County Board of Chosen Freeholders has awarded the North Plainfield School District an Open Space and Recreation grant in the amount of \$1 million. This money is dedicated to the installation of a synthetic grass playing surface on Upper Krausche Field. The grant will pay for excavation of the property, the sub grade, and drainage and the installation of synthetic grass field.

The artificial grass athletic field is tufted fabric with a polyurethane coating. The grass is 100% cryogenically-processed rubber granules. The field will have permanent lines inlaid for soccer, football, field hockey, softball and baseball. New interior fencing and gates are also included in the project. When complete, the football field will be moved closer to the home bleachers and there will be a baseball diamond in the northeast corner and a softball diamond in the northwest corner. Construction has now begun and is slated for completion in October!

The North Plainfield Education Foundation is working on projects to finish the infrastructure of the field after it is installed. Their goal is to raise money that will provide for upgrades and/or replacement for the following: concession stand, scoreboards, field lighting, sound system, landscaping, bleachers, and other projects. The sale of advertising along the fence lines and donations by generous North Plainfield school alumni will also assist the Foundation as it helps create a premiere facility that will be the centerpiece of the community. They clearly need the help of all of our alumni!

Ethel started her professional career as a Social Worker in Newark, after graduating from Cornell University. She married and raised two sons before returning to the workforce as an English teacher at NPHS in 1964. Her career at NPHS spanned more than 20 years, she taught English on

every level of jr. high through seniors. She was a very popular teacher who helped students see the relevancy of literature to their lives. Ethel provided students with a number of truly creative experiences. She worked with other teachers to develop interdisciplinary units in English. She was the driving force behind the development of the school art festival, dubbed "Creations." She was a mentor to both students and new teachers, and she was a truly unique educator. Ethel died in 2006 at age 88.

Jack Gardner Class of 1956 Memorial "Jack's Kids" Fundraiser

A long-running softball tournament benefitting children in need sponsored by Somerville Elks Lodge 1068 took place on Saturday, July 11, 2009.

Softball games across Somerset County made up the 17th Annual Jack Gardner Memorial Softball Tournament as well as festivities at the Elks Lodge afterward benefitting, "Jack's Kids" -- youngsters who have received medical help from the money generated by the event hosted by the Lodge and the Jack's Kids Committee.

The committee, named for the late Somerset County Prosecutor's Office detective and Somerset County jail warden Jack Gardner, class of

'56 of North Plainfield, has raised more than \$675,000 with the help of donors and volunteers with more than 97 percent going to local families.

Among the children being helped this year are three months old Isabella Woodward, who is battling hydrocephalus, cerebral palsy, optic atrophy in her right eye and blindness in her left eye. Meanwhile, Emily Kavanaugh, a 6 year old adoptee exposed to drugs before birth, has cerebral palsy, global developmental delays and a sensory processing disorder.

More than 80 teams began playing on 80 different fields as part of the

tournament, but that was just one element of the day-long event. As the teams finished, participants and the public at large were invited back to the lodge at 375 Union Avenue, where there were children's activities, as well as food and drinks. Donations for the festivities were \$10 per person or \$25 per family.

When the games ended as many as 1,000 people packed the facility for the entertainment and presentations to the winning teams and the families being assisted.

Niko Left His Mark on North Plainfield

(As reported by the Courier News on August 23, 2009)

The visitor sidelines will really never quite be the same at North Plainfield's Krausche Field. The post game review of a Canuck win or loss - whether home or on the road - won't ever quite be the same, or the coach's post game snack at the Sunset Diner in Green Brook. John Niko won't ever be there again.

Niko (54) died in his sleep at home a week ago Friday. John, who'd been chief of the Somerset County Jail, had told friends he wanted to go just like he did - quick, in his sleep, not in some hospital bed with tubes and machines connected. He suffered a heart attack; friends said diabetes probably was the accomplice. "We just never thought it would be this soon," said his lifetime friend Dan Battista.

John Niko wore the maroon and white of North Plainfield High School for life. He never let the grass and dirt of Krausche out of his system. He wrestled, played football. His Canucks' varsity jacket that looked worn, but solid for being more than 35 years old was displayed at his wake Friday at Bongiovi Funeral Home in Raritan Borough.

Under it was a Canucks maroon and white football jersey, No. 72. On a nearby table was a picture of a recent team picture of the Canucks after a holiday win over South Plainfield. In the upper-right hand corner was Niko.

He called his Canucks "mansters," half-monsters. He referred to the lineman as "hogs," he told the backs to "smell the goal line." He tormented us who picked against the Canucks, but also opened the passenger side door of his truck to let my colleague Jerry Carino escape the cold at halftime of a North Plainfield loss to Raritan in the Central Group II playoffs a few years ago.

He never let North Plainfield coach Bobby Lake get too far away without some kind of "suggestion," of a play that might have worked better. A week after a brutal 19-15 home loss to Hackettstown last year, the Canucks went to Blairstown and walloped North Warren 54-19. When Lake and Niko parted ways for the night after the routine snack, it wasn't the North Warren game that Niko allowed Lake to revel in, but of one or two plays that had doomed North Plainfield's chances the previous week.

"That was Neek," Lake said.

Many visitors came through the front doors of Bongiovi's and talked about a memorable guy. Some of the conversation was of his high school days - greaser day, football games, foot long subs that he and teammates devoured. The pictures on the bulletin board - many of John smiling with friends, family, teammates - told of a very happy life painting with a base color of maroon and white.
