Frequently Asked Questions About the Directory

Below is a list of the frequently asked questions in relation to directory projects that you may find helpful as you and/or your staff field inquiries about the project.

When can I expect to hear from Harris Connect?

Monday through Friday, Harris Connect makes calls beginning at 8:00 a.m. and continuing until about 9:00 p.m., in all time zones. They may try to contact you at work during the day, in the evening, or during the weekend at home. On Saturdays, they may call from 8:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.; on Sundays they call from 12:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. If you are contacted at a time that is inconvenient for you simply let the representative know. She will give you the Harris Connect toll-free number or will arrange to call you later.

If my name is listed in the directory, am I obligated to purchase a copy?

Although everyone will be given the opportunity to purchase his or her own copy of the directory, your name will be listed regardless of whether you decide to purchase a copy.

What if I don't want to be listed in the directory? What if I don't want certain pieces of information listed?

Harris Connect can still update your information for us, but will honor your specific request to exclude all or parts of your biographical data from the publication.

What happens if I don't order a directory now, but change my

mind later?

We have arranged to print as many directories as are ordered before we go to press. So, if you do change your mind prior to publication, you can call [dedicated toll-free number-please refer to my e-mail].

What forms of payment will be accepted for the purchase of a directory?

The directory may be paid for by major credit card or check. Payment(s) may be made by credit card at the time of order or by check upon receipt of the invoice(s). We also offer installment payment plans, allowing you to pay a portion now and the rest later.

If I place an order using a credit or debit card, how will the charge appear on my statement?

On statements for most major credit cards, "HC" will appear with part of or the entire name of the institution, e.g. HC State High School. On American Express statements, "Harris Connect" will appear with part of or the entire name of the institution, e.g. Harris Connect State High School.

What if I decide I want to cancel the order I have placed?

Orders for the directory may be canceled by simply writing the word "Cancel" on the invoice and returning it to Harris Connect or by calling the Harris Connect Customer Service Department at 1-800-877-6554. Be sure to provide the account number when calling.

Bette Betzold Dealaman, NPHS, '44 George Dealaman, NPHS, '37 Recognized

The family of George Dealaman and Bette Dealaman were on hand recently at the meeting of the Warren Township Committee to accept recognition on behalf of their parents for their estate's \$100,000.00 gift to the Warren Public Library.

A group of about a dozen family members heard Mayor Carol Ann Garafola and Deputy Mayor Victor Sordillo read two plaques expressing the gratitude of the community for the Dealaman Family gift.

George Dealaman, Sr., died in April 2007 at the age of 89 and his wife, Bette, died a year later at the age of 81. Both were graduates of North Plainfield High School in 1937 and 1944.

Mayor Garafola said that the Dealaman family had already been generous to the Warren Library having made a previous \$50,000.00 contribution to the library's expansion several years ago.

The Dealamans always believed in giving back to the community and the grandchildren have been active since they were children in programs offered at the library.

George Dealaman, Sr. served on the Township Committee for several terms in the 1980's and 1990's including several terms as Mayor.

Somerset County Freeholders OK Grants to Overhaul Athletic Fields

SOMERVILLE - Freeholders have approved grants for school districts in Somerville and North Plainfield to overhaul their athletic fields.

The grants of up to \$1 million are separate from engineering and bidding services that the county also intends to provide for those districts, which both want to install new synthetic turf fields.

The Somerville school district wants to turn Brooks Field into a turf field, while the North Plainfield district wants Krausche Field renovated into a turf facility.

"We're ecstatic and eternally grateful to the freeholders for making such a grant to us," Somerville Superintendent Carolyn Leary said.

The districts had applied in January to participate in the new county program that uses open space dollars for recreation upgrades. Both applications were approved by the county Open Space Advisory Committee.

Freeholder Director Rick Fontana said the county is managing the projects for the sake of efficiency and to take advantage of any cost savings.

"There's a great concern on the Open Space Committee's part, and I think also the freeholders, that the projects be done properly," Fontana said. "Not to say that the towns can't do it, but we have more resources and God forbid something happens and, say, drainage is done improperly. That's a key thing that could cost a lot of money."

Fontana said he believes the grants are sufficient to complete the projects as presented. The county's contribution to construction is capped at \$1 million, though one district can use more of that sum than the other, depending on the details of the job, he said.


Officials said Somerville would use

money that supporters had raised for the field improvements to convert a second field used for field hockey into a turf field, though that project would be bid out with the other to help reduce the price.

County officials announced the program in December. Voters approved a referendum in 2005 allowing the county to use up to 25 percent of its Open Space, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund to pay for the development or improvement of existing recreational facilities.

Fontana and others have said the local public would also be able to use the refurbished facilities, not just high school teams.

fornia, the world's largest volunteerdriven fundraising group for childhood cancer research. Since its founding in 1999, more than 72,000 heads have been shaved and \$50 Million Dollars has been raised for childhood cancer research.

North Plainfield High School played a big part in this year's fundraiser. Nine boys on the NPHS football team, plus Assistant Coach Ted Amo, offered to have their heads shaved. "It's been a good cause and I like being part of something that helps," said Luis Salazar, defensive tackle on the NPHS team.

"I love to volunteer and help people," said Vellis Burnette, team fullback.

"They're part of the 'Play It Smart' program, teaching community service to nurture them as students, not just players," said the boy's Academic Coach, Deanne D'Armiento.

The football group was responsible


for raising \$1,844.00 for the St. Baldrick's Foundation.





1933 Graduate Featured in The Courier-News

Frank Salvato, a lifelong resident of Warren, was the focus of a featured article in the Courier-News on January 5, 2009. He was recently sworn in to another three-year term on the Warren Township Committee. He has the distinction of being the youngest elected member of an official body in New Jersey and also the oldest office holder in New Jersey.

Salvato began working in public service at age 22 when he first became active with and elected to the Republican County Committee. Now at 93 years of age he is looking forward to serving sixty-five years of elective office in the Township.

Not all 65 years would have been spent on the Township Committee. He spent twenty-seven years on the Watchung Hills Regional High School Board of Education. Sometimes, as Board Vice-President or President.

Mayor Gary DiNardo said that he's always been an advocate for the people.

The Salvato name has been associated with the Township for more than a century. Frank was born on the old homestead on Mount Horeb Road where he still lives today.

He also remembers attending the Little Red School House on the corner of the homestead and North Plainfield High School where he graduated in 1933. In 2006, he was inducted into the North Plainfield High School Alumni Hall of Fame for his devotion and commitment to community service.

Well into his ninth decade, Salvato

calls himself a gentleman farmer with steers, chickens and other animals to tend to daily on the homestead. But he also continues to enjoy the nuts-and-bolts work of the township government.

According to former mayor, John Coley, "He's been nothing but a great asset to Warren."


