The community of North Plainfield suffered a great loss on April 21, 2009 with the passing of Dr. Marie O'Brien. After serving the Borough's educational system for over 56 years, Dr. O'Brien left a legacy of dedication, love and passion for the English language that few educators can boast. If you could listen to some of the letters written by her former students at her service at St. Mary's Church, it would give you goose bumps. These students were doctors, writers and professional people who showed their appreciation to Dr. O'Brien for exposing them to this love of writing, speaking, literature and the plain, good old English language.

Speaking personally, I am not a doctor or a highly professional person but Miss O'Brien left a touch of her Irish heart that is hard to explain. I swear, she must have mastered the art of teaching by osmosis. When I found out who my English teacher was, I think I broke out in a cold sweat. But after being in her class for a short time, I felt comfortable with the class with Miss O'Brien and with a language that used to sound like Greek to me. To this day I still have bad dreams about showing up in Marie O'Brien's class without my homework but to my surprise, sixty years later I can still recite a passage from Macbeth.

To honor Dr. O'Brien for her dedication to teaching the English language, on behalf of all of her former students, the NPHS Alumni Association would like to dedicate the Fourth Alumni Directory to the memory of Dr. Marie O'Brien.

Personally, words are not enough to show my appreciation for everything she has taught me, so I would like to keep her memory alive through twenty years of alumni newsletters. I'm sure there are many misspelled words and errors but I am also sure she will forgive me seeing they were written from the heart.

Dr. Marie O'Brien

October 23, 1919 – April 21, 2009

In her 56 year career at North Plainfield High School, Dr. Marie O'Brien taught three generations of students how to write. As a teacher of English, head of the English department, and district supervisor of language arts, Dr. O'Brien always stressed the importance to students of becoming a good writer.

"The more you write, the better you will become" became Dr. O'Brien's rallying cry.



The Dr. Marie O'Brien Excellence in Writing Award was created to celebrate Dr. O'Brien's fiftieth year in the district and to recognize the huge contributions Dr. O'Brien has made in that area of teacher. That award has

been generously supported by generations of alumni who gained a great deal in Dr. O'Brien classes.

Dr. Marie O'Brien held a Bachelor of Arts in English from Montclair State University; a Master of Arts from Columbia University; and a PhD. from Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Even with these degrees, she never stopped learning and has amassed more credits in graduate study than any other professional in the district. The recommendation that accompanied Dr. O'Brien's original placement papers from Montclair State many years ago has held true for her entire career:

"She is enthusiastic and sympathetic . . . Her love for teaching is evident, and manifests itself in the attitude of her students."

Grover G. DeVault, 1948

Military – Ministry
Community Service

Grover DeVault has devoted his life to the Military and Ministry as well as community service. He is a highly decorated military officer (LTC) and his records demonstrate achievements and accomplishments rarely reflected by others. Legion of Merit and Bronze Star for combat during 20 years of active duty. Founder of the Christian Military Fellowship and the International Assoc. of Military Chaplains, and is currently development of the chaplaincy of PA State Police force. Beverly (nee Gaston)

Kochard, 1969
Education

Beverly is currently Vice President for Student Affairs and Dean of Students, at Moravian College, Bethlehem, PA. She has held this position since 1990, and is responsible for Moravian's residence life, counseling, student activities, student conduct, career development, academic assistance, campus safety, Greek Life, leadership development and many more activities. Prior to her position at Moravian, she was the Director of Development at Albright College. Before her work at Albright, she was the Assistant Dean of Students at Moravian College. She was in college administration

initially at McShea College Center at Allentown College. Beverly earned her BA at Moravian College and her MEA at Lehigh University.

Joseph A. Scarola, 1965 Medicine

Dr. Scarola is the Assistant Vice President and Senior Scientific Advisor for Drug Development for Wyeth Pharmaceuticals Worldwide. He is currently responsible for devising strategy and directing the clinical staff for development of drugs for Wyeth in the challenging environment of Japan. Joe joined Wyeth in 1988 after twelve years of private practice. After joining Wyeth Research, he became involved with the development of investigational medication, initially in the area of arthritis and subsequently in organ transplantation. He directed two successful programs, culminating in the regulatory approval in numerous countries of one medication for arthritis and one medication to prevent organ transplant rejections. Joe is a Summa Cum Laude, Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Rutgers, and received his MD from Johns Hopkins. Joe and his wife the former Barbara Lombardo, have four children and will be retuning to their home in Collegeville, PA in March of 2009.

Terry Silverlight, 1975 Music and Entertainment

Terry Silverlight has been involved with many facets of the music business and has contributed his musical talents as a leader, composer, producer, arranger, drummer, author and educator to projects in almost every style of music.

Terry began his recording career at the age of 14 when he played drums on his brother Barry Miles's album, "White Heat", an innovative harbinger of the fusion movement. Since then, he's performed all over the world and has played drums on

gold and platinum recordings for Billy Ocean, George Benson, Natalie Merchant, Freddie Jackson, Stephanie Mills, Tom Jones, Laura Nyro, Anne Murray, Mel Torme, Jennifer Holladay, Phil Woods, The Fania All - Stars, The CTI All-Stars, Jonathan Butler, movie scores for One Fine Day, You've Got Mail, Object of My Affection, Titus, Frida, Slaves of New York, What Planet Are You From, and countless jingles and TV shows. Terry has toured extensively with artists such as Roberta Flack and the award-winning, all-star, Manhattan Jazz Orchestra.

Ethel Piness Abrams, 1935 Education

Ethel started her professional career as a Social Worker in Newark, after graduating from Cornell University. She married and raised two sons before returning to the workforce as an English teacher at NPHS in 1964. Her career at NPHS spanned more than 20 years, she taught English on every level of jr. high through seniors. She was a very popular teacher who helped students see the relevancy of literature to their lives. Ethel provided students with a number of truly creative experiences. She worked with other teachers to develop interdisciplinary units in English. She was the driving force behind the development of the school art festival, dubbed "Creations." She was a mentor to both students and new teachers, and she was a truly unique educator. Ethel died in 2006 at age 88.

Dick Williams, Class of 1962

Somerset County "Citizen of the Year"

Dick Williams, a 1962 graduate of North Plainfield High School and a lifelong resident of Somerset County, was presented with the "Citizen of the Year" award recently at the Somerset County Business Partnership Awards Dinner at the Martinsville Inn.

Sometimes referred to as, "Mr. Somerset County," Williams was honored for serving eighteen years as Somerset County's administrator, overseeing a \$214 million budget and more than 1,000 employees.

"I don't necessarily deserve it," he said, explaining the county's

smooth operations are mostly due to the quality of the department heads and the employees.

Among the biggest accomplishments during his tenure, Williams lists the County's recycling program - the only program that touches all county residents.

Other accomplishments include the construction of TD Bank Ballpark in Bridgewater "at no cost to the taxpayers" and the County's purchase of Natirar, the 500-acre former estate of the late King Hassan II of Morocco, in Peapack-Gladstone.

Raised in North Plainfield, Williams, who calls himself a "Borough Kind of Guy", said he enjoys the quality of life offered in Somerset County's towns.

North Plainfield Education Foundation To Raise Money for Kraushe Field Renovations

The Somerset County Board of Chosen Freeholders has awarded the North Plainfield School District an Open Space and Recreation grant in the amount of \$1 million. This money is dedicated to the installation of a synthetic grass playing surface on Upper Krausche Field. The grant will pay for excavation of the property, the subgrade, and drainage. It also includes synthetic grass with permanent lines inlaid for soccer, football, field hockey, softball and baseball. New interior fencing and gates are also included in the project. Construction is to begin on or about July 7, 2009 and be completed for the opening of school in September.

The project will move the football field closer to the home bleachers, with a baseball diamond in the northeast corner and a softball diamond in the northwest corner.

The artificial grass athletic field is tufted fabric with a polyurethane coating. The grass is 100% cryogenically-processed rubber granules.

The North Plainfield Education Foundation is working on projects to enhance the field installation. Our goal is to raise money that will provide for upgrades and/or replacement for the following: concession stand, scoreboards, field lighting, sound system, landscaping, bleachers, and other projects. The sale of advertising along the fence lines and donations by generous North Plainfield school alumni will also assist the Foundation as it helps create a premiere facility that will be the centerpiece of the community.
