The 14th Annual NPHS Hall of Fame Induction banquet was held October 4, 2008 at the Italian American Club in North Plainfield. Over one hundred classmates, friends, family, and teachers attended to honor Frank Cognetti, Thomas Barrett, James Marchio, Erin Johnson Abbott, and Dr. John Klimas. It would have to be classified as a tremendous success.

The North Plainfield High School Alumni Hall of Fame was established in 1995 by the NPHS Alumni Association to recognize and honor the outstanding graduates who have distinguished themselves in their respective fields or professions. The actual Hall of Fame is located in the new cafeteria at NPHS. Approximately 125 inductees have been honored with a plaque with the picture and their biography. They each have a brick placed in the NPHS Alumni Walk of Honor in front of the gymnasium on Wilson Avenue.

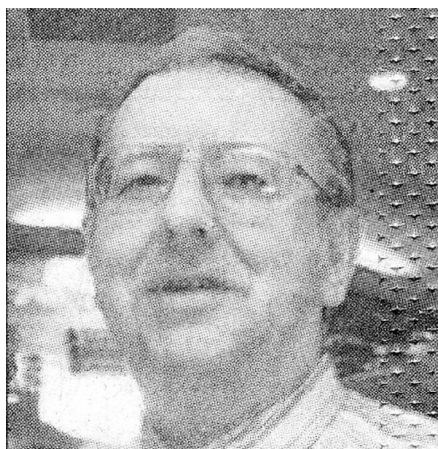
1958 Grad Retires From Italian American Club

Arthur Abruzzese, Jr. was honored recently with a club dinner and a proclamation from Mayor Janice Allen for forty-one years of service as manager of the North Plainfield Italian American Club where he helped build it from the ground up, both literally and figuratively.

On the site of the Italian American Club at 403 Somerset Street in North Plainfield there was a house that was purchased, torn down and a new building erected. The then 22-year old Abruzzese was involved from the foundation up and later became the general manager of the club.

Abruzzese's father, Arthur, Sr. was one of the original founding members of the club in 1948 and was the oldest surviving founder until he died at 100 years old in 2004.

Mayor Allen labeled the organiza-

tion "an invaluable asset" to the Borough. Abruzzese's daughter, Maria, may have summed it up, "The building itself stands for community and embraces a changed world. After all, isn't that what our Italian ancestors came to this melting pot for?"

"Canuckling" Receives Awards

North Plainfield High School's literary and art magazine, Canuckling, was awarded the Columbia Scholastic Press Association's "Gold Medalist Certificate" and the American Scholastic Press Association's "First Place with Special Merit" for the second year in a row.

The Canuckling magazine is published each year in June, with the first issue published in 1955. The most recent title of the magazine is Images, named to represent the

various ways that student contributors see and look at the world. The previous magazine is titled Identity, providing a strong sampling of the many ways that students define themselves and others as teenagers in the 21st century.

With 106 pages of the high school's student poets, artists, photographers, and story tellers, the 2008 Canuckling is an example of the excellent work of the students at NPHS. Canuckling club members met every other Tuesday in 2007-2008 to do whatever had to be done to get the final proof ready for the printer. Every one of the Canuckling student staff also played a role in creative support by writing or by creating art or photographs for the magazine. For example, the cover is the work of

Jeremy Frusco, a talented senior who graduated last year. Editors from Columbia Scholastic called his work "exceptional." The advisors for the magazine were Ellen Brain and Andrew Risoli, both NPHS English teachers. Kim Dawson, NPHS Art teacher, provided her support by supplying photos of student-generated art work, and by digitally enhancing and organizing pictures into the software package. The entire Language Arts Department encouraged development of material for consideration into the magazine, while the ESL Department also partnered to provide input.

The Canuckling is but one example of the creativity, intellect, and community service activities of North Plainfield's students highlighted in this issue of the Community Newsletter.

Winners and Still National Champions!

For the second year in a row, the North Plainfield High School Varsity Cheerleading Team has won the prestigious AmeriCheer National Team Community Involvement Award. The team received this honor for representing their community at numerous local, state and national community service and cheerleading-related events.

The NPHS Team was recognized for events such as its two trips to Montoursville, Pennsylvania, visiting the community that lost sixteen students and five adult chaperones when their TWA Flight 800 crashed off Long Island in 1996. The Cheerleading Team made the trips on July 17 last year and this year, the 11th and 12th anniversary of the crash, holding memorials at the high school, at the Flight 800 Memorial Park and at the grave sites of the victims.

The NPHS Team received national recognition when, keeping a cheerleading tradition alive, the members made a 1,000 mile trip to hold memorials at all three 9-11 attack sites. As part of their trip, they flew American flags at Ground Zero, Shanksville Pennsylvania, and the Pentagon. The trip was highlighted when they flew the only American Flag known to have flown over Pearl Harbor and all three 9-11 sites. They also made a special presentation inside the Pentagon of the first American Flag known to have flown over the three 9-11 sites.

The cheerleaders also represented their community by leading the 2007 and 2008 Fourth of July Parades, proudly flying their 9-11 flags. They held a service at the high school's war memorial honoring veterans on Veteran's Day. Later that year, over fifty North Plainfield cheerleaders held a memorial in front of the same monument on Pearl Harbor Day honoring Joe Waller, a local veteran of World War II.

The NPHS Cheerleading Team received a special thank you message

from the Virginia Tech cheerleaders and coaching staff for two large megaphones sent to them by the North Plainfield cheerleaders. The megaphones were signed by cheerleaders from all over America, and were filled with messages of love and caring for the students killed on the Virginia Tech campus last fall. Twenty-five North Plainfield cheerleaders also represented their community when, for a second year in a row, they performed in a pre-game show for the NBA's New Jersey Nets at the Meadowlands.

The NPHS Cheerleading Team also restarted a competitive cheerleading program with a special performance at The Holiday Lights Competition at St. Peter's College in Jersey City. They competed in three categories, earning a third place trophy for stunt group in the Mid Atlantic Championship at the Sovereign Bank Arena in Trenton; a second place team trophy at the Island Championships at the Wildwood Convention Center; and a first place individual trophy at the Mid Atlantic Championships. Both stunt team and individual competitors received scores qualifying them for the CANAM International Championships in Myrtle Beach.

The NPHS Cheerleading Team is the

only high school team to ever receive the AmeriCheer National Team Community Involvement Award. Not only that, this is the second consecutive year that they won the award, and they were the first high school team ever to win the award when they received it last year.

NPHS 1951 Graduate Honored

A recent catered luncheon held at the Warrenville Senior Center was a bittersweet event for center manager Alwayne Blechar.

The luncheon, held Dec. 11, 2008, was the last official event for Blechar, who is retiring.

While Blechar has been the full-time manager of the senior center since February 2007, and served as acting manager of the township center, since March 2006, her presence has left a record of accomplishments.

During Blechar's brief tenure, the center, a stone-faced building on the grounds of Warrenbrook Golf Course, installed an attractive pool table room and a stairlift to help give members a ride up to the second floor.

According to Angela Dubivsky, nutrition program administrator for the Somerset County Office of Aging, Blechar's superior management and leadership style has produced a 9.5 percent increase in attendance.

"The center is filled to capacity for every event she hosts," Dubivsky said, adding that 14 regular activities now fill the center's monthly calendar.

Blechar's record of success is no accident, and she revealed how she acquired her can-do management style.

"Well, I spent 38 years as a civil employee providing full-time support for the Army Reserve program," Blechar said.

Her administrative perspective has a military precision about it, Dubivsky said.

"After graduating from North Plainfield High School, Class of 1951, Alwayne attended many seminars in her career with the Army Reserve on management, human be-

havior, leadership and supervision. For five years, Alwayne was responsible, full-time, for military-personnel operations and support of the entire 78th Division," Dubivsky explained.

Those traits translated into a flurry of activity when Blechar became an active member of the Warrenville Senior Center 10 years ago, after retiring from her Army Reserve career with many citations and awards for service.

Among them is her receipt in 1989 of the Meritorious Civilian Service Award, one of the highest awards that can be earned by civilian employees of the federal government.

"I loved my career in government," Blechar said. "You had to think quickly when making decisions. On weekends you got to meet the Reservists, who could be teachers, chief executive officers or a UPS driver.

It was exciting and fun."

Dubivsky noted Blechar joined the center soon thereafter, as a volunteer Income Tax Counselor.

Blechar soon was helping with special events and then with extensive renovations to the building. "Alwayne spent countless hours helping to strip wallpaper," Dubivsky said.

Even when Blechar was named the center's manager, she continued to turn her energies to more than just administrative tasks.

"I spent a lot of time cleaning out closets and organizing materials. Then I found space for a coat closet," Blechar said. She also responded to members' requests for a book nook, now located in the dining area, "where people like to linger and talk," Blechar said.

Blechar said she now is truly retired, but notes that "one should always have some purpose in life."

Elmer Squier, 87, died October 5, 2008. He was a 1938 graduate of NPHS.

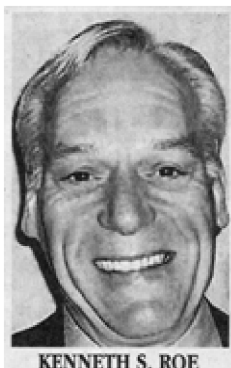
David Arthur Taylor, 51, died October 7, 2008. He was a 1976 graduate of NPHS.

Margaret Jean Schenck Polotrak, 80, died November 13, 2008. She was a 1946 graduate of NPHS.

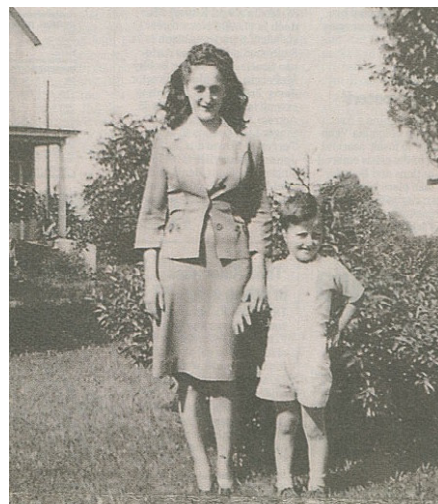
